HARVESTING A GARDEN OF POSSIBILITIES AMONGST THE IMPOSSIBLE

In the summertime, I like to spend a half hour to an hour in the garden each day. I enjoy this time, and I find it to be about the right about of time to keep the weeds under control, the plants pruned and healthy, and the fruits picked.

Last July, my family and I left for camping for a week. Before the trip, I picked the beans and weeded as much as time allowed. But it was a glorious growing season with just the right amount of rain and sunshine for most of the vegetables and all of the weeds.

When we returned, I stared at my garden and didn't know

"Just help for one row," I said. "It will go fast if everyone helps."

With a sigh, she came back and plopped down by the beans with an ice cream pail and began picking. I started picking the next row. My seven-year-old weeded between the plants, my five-year-old found the red tomatoes, and my twoyear-old circled us all, occasionally dropping a bean or a tomato in our buckets. Meanwhile, my husband and son mowed the lawn, which

also seemed to grow at an astonishing rate.

After about two hours, the girls and I had managed to work the garden back into shape. We had the fruits and vegetables harvested and the weeds, for the most part, removed.

As my daughter approached the end of her last row of carrots, she said. "At first it seemed like we would never get done, but we just kept going, and then we got to the end pretty quickly."

In many ways, I feel like this campaign is like gardening. It is a large, overwhelming task that we are trying to accomplish in a short amount of time. It is not a task for one person, but for many, all working together, using their talents and abilities.

Everyone is able to contribute in different ways through prayer, service and gifts. Sometimes a significant donation comes in, and one of our buckets fills quickly. But to completely fill all our buckets, we need many gifts of all sizes. Every contribution is important and appreciated.

THE PLANS

Phase 1: Tuckpointing the brick and replacing the windows, a new HVAC system, electrical system, and plumbing, sprinklers for the second and third floors, kitchen and bathrooms remodeled with new appliances, fixtures, countertops, cabinets, and flooring, classrooms and hallways would have new paint, flooring, repaired ceilings, and refinished woodwork, improved security by updating the front and back doors, installing more security cameras, and adding another layer of security to the front entrance, and a oneway drop-off and pick-up area for vehicles.

Phase 2: A new secure entrance and lobby, all administrative offices would be relocated near the entrance for efficiency and extra safety and an elevator.

Our minimum goal of \$5,600,000 enables us to complete phase 1 and begin some work on phase 2.

The campaign stretch goal of \$8,600,000 will allow us to complete phase one and two around the same time. If we could reach our stretch goal we would have many cost savings.
